We write in support of the Rhode Island Department of Health's (RIDOH) application to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in response to Funding Opportunity Number: CDC-RFA-DP20-2004, BOLD Public Health Programs to Address Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementias.
